It's time to think beyond being at home

Stay prepared with emergency preparedness kits when not at home

- Create a kit yourself
- Purchase one and add to it to meet your personal needs (we recommend adding some additional, ready-to-eat, food and more water!)
- Have an emergency preparedness kit or supplies at work, school, daycares, in each vehicle

In disasters, you & your neighbors will be each other's first responders

- Who will need special assistance?
- Who has specialized skills or resources to assist in disasters?

In disasters, you & your co-workers will be each other's first responders

- Do each of you have emergency food, water, a flashlight, blanket?

- Where should you go to help out?
